

I was educated in five countries and had a long international teaching career before I recently began a brand new career in social work.

After graduating from a Jesuit school in Nepal, I received an international high school diploma from <u>United World College of the Adriatic</u> in Italy, then a bachelor's degree from a private liberal arts college in the US, and finally a teaching degree from UNSW in Australia.

My international teaching career, lasting over 15 years, spanned international schools in ten different countries, four of which were <u>United World Colleges</u>. During my stay abroad, I travelled to about three-dozen different countries.

There are currently 14 United World Colleges around the world. The goals of the United World College movement is to bring children between 16-18 years of age to build bridges of understanding—what was referred to as International Understanding—and contribute to peace in the world.

Presentation Objectives

- To inspire people to believe in and trust humanity
- To inspire people to believe that they can contribute to understanding between people of different nationalities, cultures and religions and thereby contribute to peace in the world
- To inspire people to live meaningful lives

Presentation Description

- Target Audience: undergraduate or graduate students or adults above the age of 17.

A multimedia presentation about my experiences as a Tibeto-Nepalese growing up in a Hindu Kingdom attending a Jesuit school in Nepal, continuing with education in vastly differing countries, and topping that off with an international teaching experience around the world.

During all that time, while I <u>suffered both in Nepal</u> and <u>abroad</u> from discrimination, because of the context and circumstances of my birth, I discovered <u>compassion</u> and humanity in

abundance. Had it not been for humanity, I would have been in a completely different place right now—possibly serving <u>a seven-year jail sentence</u> in Qatar! Humanity will ultimately save humanity itself.
